


## Rolling Out Shift to Shift Report on 8E

The Ouellette Campus has officially launched Shift to Shift Report on 8E. To promote an efficient Shift to Shift Report, the new patient summary tool has been included in the process. This is a living document that is designed to capture patient information and is a quick reference for nurses, not only at verbal Shift to Shift Report, but also throughout the day. When not in use, the report is kept at the patient bedside. This allows the entire care team ready access to a summary of the patient's information—right at point of care!

To ensure a smooth roll out, the SOP Standard Unit Team met with the front line nursing and clerical staff to provide education regarding the new tool and the Shift to Shift Report process. Thank you to 8E staff for all of your effort and enthusiasm as we launch!

## Updates to the Best Possible Medication History (BPMH)

The Medication Process Improvement Project (MPIP) Team, in its continued efforts to reduce the possibility of patients experiencing a medication error, is focused on completing a Best Possible Medication History (BPMH) in the Emergency Department (ED).

A key element of a successful BPMH is the form itself. Members of the MPIP Team will be consulting with their nursing, physician and pharmacy colleagues to participate in a test of the new process and form in late June. The resulting form and process will then be tested in the ED at both campuses.
