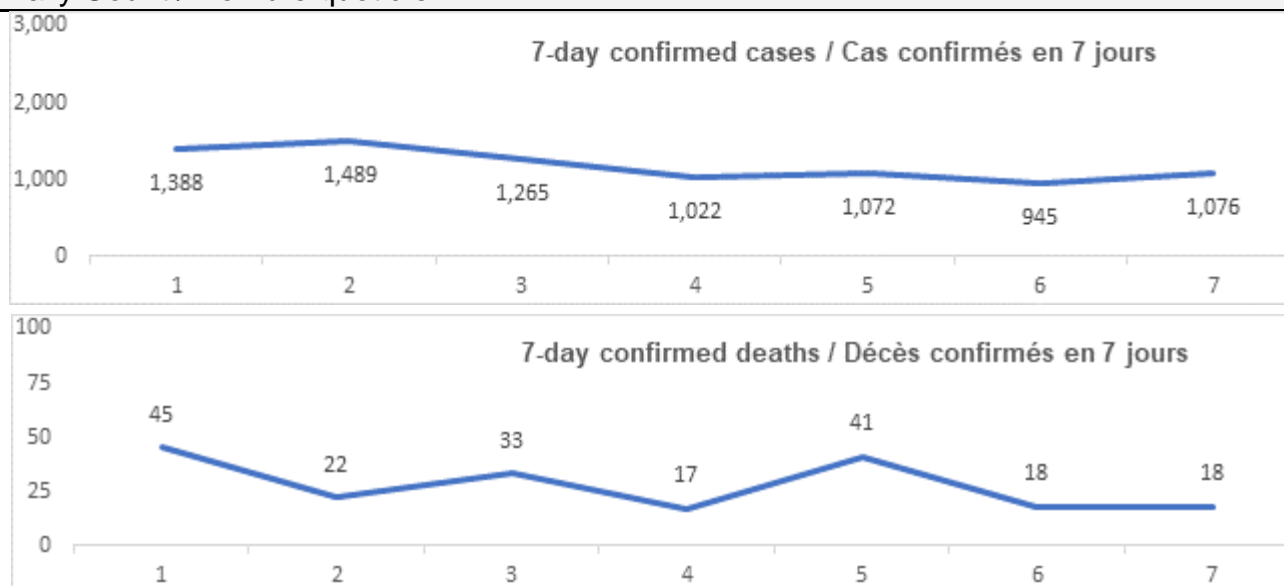

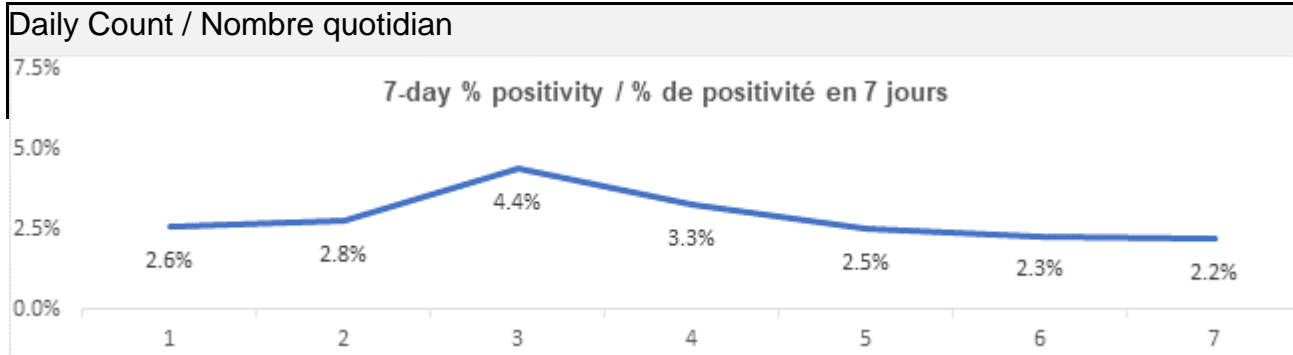

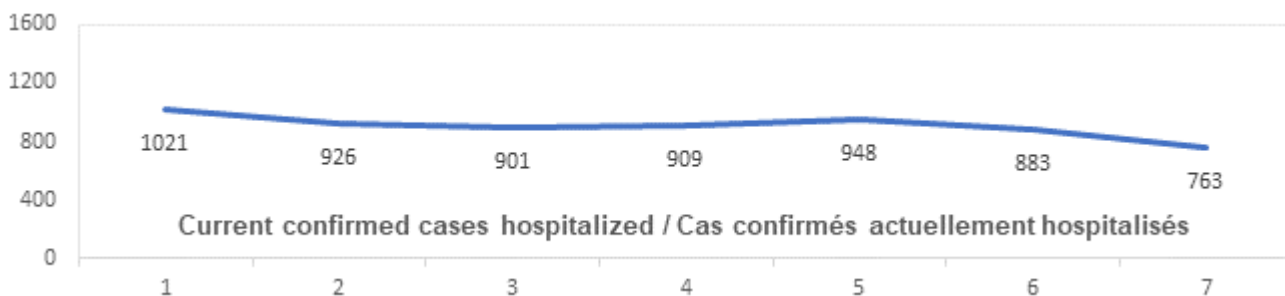

## Update

- Ontario Deploys Rapid Tests to More Essential Workplaces and Settings. Based on the successful use of rapid tests in select settings across the province the Ontario government is deploying test kits to more essential workplaces and sectors in order to quickly identify and help stop the spread of COVID-19. Rapid tests are now being used in long-term care homes, retirement homes, congregate care settings, First Nations communities and many essential workplaces.
- Ontario Returning 27 Public Health Regions to Strengthened COVID-19 Response Framework. In consultation with the Chief Medical Officer of Health, the Ontario government is transitioning twenty-seven public health regions out of the shutdown and into a revised and strengthened COVID-19 Response Framework: Keeping Ontario Safe and Open (the "Framework"). The four remaining public health regions, Toronto Public Health, Peel Public Health, York Region Public Health and North Bay Parry Sound District, will remain in the shutdown, and the Stay-at-Home order and all existing public health and workplace safety measures will continue to apply to these four public health regions.

## Weekly Frequently Asked Questions – Friday February 12 Edition

### **What is COVaxON?**

Ontario has a secure cloud-based provincial solution called COVaxON supporting COVID-19 vaccine clinics and administration sites. COVaxON provides standard processes and a common set of digital tools (e.g., client management, recording administered doses, inventory management, receipt of vaccination) to ensure standardized, timely and high-quality data for the provincial response.

The system is available **real-time, anywhere, anytime**, as long as the user has an authorized account, the appropriate **IT device, browser and connectivity**.

### **What is Ontario's plan to provide Ontarians with documentation for proof of vaccination.**

Each individual vaccinated will receive a printed receipt of vaccination from the provincial solution COVaxON and, if they consent to receive information electronically and provide the needed details, they will receive a digital receipt electronically.

Ontario Digital Service (ODS) will be investigating, taking this receipt and establishing a more verifiable credential that will be aligned with the ODS Digital Identity initiative and other usages of the receipt as they evolve.

### **What are the steps for eligible health care professionals to administer the vaccine? Where will they be allowed to administer the vaccines?**

As the vaccine supply increases and guided by the Ethical Framework for COVID-19 vaccine distribution, Ontario is enabling more health care providers to administer the vaccine as quickly and safely as possible. This will help meet the unprecedented demand in the number of people who will be getting the vaccine. It will also increase access to the vaccine for all Ontarians, whether they reside in a remote fly-in community or a large urban centre.

Expanded health care professionals who will be able to administer the vaccine can register and apply through Ontario's Matching Portal and includes:

- Nurse practitioner, registered nurses and registered practical nurses; and
- Pharmacists, pharmacy students, interns and pharmacy technicians.

We have amended our regulations to ensure that expanded health care professionals are able to administer the vaccine.
